To the Honorable the Judge of Said Court in pursuance of notice given me, by the Solicitor for the Plaintiff in the above entitled cause, and the annexed order of the Court referring the above cause for the purpose of taking testimony therein I Arthur H. Willard one of the Standing Examiners of your Honorable Court duly appointed qualified and sworn did on the 21st day of February 1902 at the law office of Wm and Wm Eggen, in Frederick City, Maryland, proceed to take the following testimony to wit:—

Samuel T. Simmons, a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Plaintiff having first been duly sworn and examined deposes and says 1st. State your name age and residence?
ans. Samuel T. Simmons age 68 years and I reside in Urbana Dist. Frederick Co. Maryland.
2nd. Did you know William Williams in his life time is he living or dead, and if dead when did he die?

ans. I knew him he lived on the farm of adjoining me, in Frederick County, Maryland. He is dead having died about the month of June 1901.
3rd. What real estate did he own at the time of his death, if any?—

ans. He owned a farm adjoining mine containing about 170 acres of land situated in Urbana Dist. Frederick County, Maryland, composed of the various parcels described in Exhibits Nos. 2-3-4-5- filed in this cause. — Exhibits Nos. 1-2-3-4-5- are at this juncture filed with the Examiner as evidence of Plaintiff and so marked by Examiner. — He had an interest in a piece of land at Simonsville and worked a quarry there but I don't know whether he bought the land or not?

4th. Did William Williams have any children descendants or kindred surviving him?—

ans. None that I ever heard of

5th. How long did you know him, and how long have you known him?

ans. about 35 years, I lived adjoining him all that time.
