19. Do you know whether Mr. Williams ever paid Mrs. Thomas for her services, or paid back the money borrowed?

ans. I don't think he did.

ans. Mammie Thomas, my full name is Mary J. Thomas, age 36 years and I reside in Frederick County Maryland near Urbana

2. Did you know William Williams in his lifetime is he living or dead, and if dead, when did he die, and what property if any did he own at the time of his death?

ans. Yes sir, I knew him, he is dead having died on the 24th day of June 1896. He owned a farm in Urbana District this County at the time of his death containing about 100 acres of land, said farm is made up of several tracts all adjoining which are Comely described by Exhibits 1-2-3-4- and 5- filed in this case, he owned about an acre of land situated near Jjamsville in this County, described in a deed from Mary and Eliza Bell to William Williams, William Williams and William Perry, a Certified Copy of which said deed
