A hundred dollars a year is a very reasonable charge for that work. Mrs. Williams told me a number of times of his having borrowed money from wife and that he intended to pay her back with interest, my wife made these loans out of money she had received from me and her father, she rendered the services and made the loans, I have mentioned independently of me and on her own account, during all of this time I lived in Washington City, and whatever she did in this matter she did in the behalf.
