would it be to the interests and advantage of all concerned, and especially would it be conducive to the interests of the infant defendant, if the property could be sold, and the proceeds of the infant defendant, if the property could be sold, and the proceeds arising therefrom be distributed among the parties entitled thereto according to their respective interests and priorities, and they charge that the said land is not susceptible of partition and division among the parties entitled thereto without great loss, damage and injury.

Wherefore your complainants pray your Honor.

1. To pass a decree directing the sale of the property, appointing a trustee or trustees, for that purpose, as is usual in such cases, and ordering a distribution of the proceeds among the parties entitled thereto according to their respective interests and priorities.

2. To grant unto your complainants the writs of Subpoena in the regular form directed to the said defendants, to wit: Elizabeth Fogle and Samuel J. Fogle, her husband; Ira Boone, infant, and George B. Blumenthal, Mortgagee, all residents of Frederick County; and Sarah Hood and Clayton Hood, her husband, all of Carroll County, Maryland, commanding them and each of them to appear before your Honorable Court, at some time certain to be named therein, in person or by Solicitor, answer the premises, abide by and perform such a decree, as may be passed therein.
