The object of this Suit is to procure a decree for the Sale of the Real Estate of which Joshua Biggs and Peter S. Biggs died Seized and possessed and to have the lot of ground sold to James S. Biggs in his life time. Conveyed to his widow and heirs at law and to have the proceeds of the Sale distributed among the parties interested according to their several rights therein.

The Bill states that Joshua Biggs died Seized and possessed of three tracts of land, situated in Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, leaving surviving him his widow, Peter S. Biggs and four children William H. Biggs Robert Biggs, James S. Biggs, and David M. Biggs as his heirs at law; that Peter S. Biggs acquired the interest of William H. Biggs in said properties and died leaving a last will duly executed to convey estate in which she devised her interest in the land referred to above and in certain real estate, acquired by her personally to James S. Biggs, and David M. Biggs, Robert Biggs, and Robert Biggs, Trustee for William H. Biggs; that said land is not susceptible of partition without material loss and injury, and praying for the passage of a decree for the Sale of said property, and the division of the proceeds.

That Thomas Biggs, one of the parties in interest is a non-resident of the State of Maryland.

It is thereupon, this 27th. day of May, 1908. ordered by the Circuit Court, for Frederick County in Equity that the plaintiffs by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County, once in each of four successive weeks before the 29th. day of June, 1908. Give notice to the said Thomas Bruce Biggs of the object and substance of this Bill of Complaint warning them to be and appear in this Court in person or by attorney on or before the 18th. day of July next to show Cause, if any he has, why a decree ought not to be passed as prayed.
