becomes a party to this cause to the end that said real estate may be sold free clear of her dower right as said widow, reserving her right to an allowance of such portion of the net proceeds of sale as may be just and equitable.

That petitioners are all residents of the state of Maryland, and are adults, except Mary Hardey and George Hardey, who are infants.

That the defendants George S. Hardey and Adeline Hardey, his wife, are citizens of the state of California.

That the domicile and address of the defendant William S. Hardey, are unknown.

That said property cannot be divided without loss or injury to the parties interested nor can a good and sufficient deed be made on account of the infancy of the said Mary Hardey and George Hardey, and that it would be for the interest of those entitled to a share in said estate that the property be sold under decree of the Court, and the net proceeds be distributed to said parties as their respective interests may appear.

To the end therefore -

Your petitioners pray your Honor that the premises may be sold under a decree of your Honorable Court, and that the proceeds thereof, after the payment of the costs and expenses of these proceedings may be distributed to the parties entitled to the same as their respective interests may appear.

May it please your Honor to grant unto your petitioners an Order of Publication against William S. Hardey, George J. Hardey and Adeline Hardey, his wife, adult non-residents named in this Bill, warning them to be and appear in your Honorable Court on some day certain to be named therein, and answer the premises and to abide by and perform such decree as may be made therein.

It is therefore this 27th day of January, A.D. 1909, ordered and decreed by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, as a Court of Equity, and by the authority thereof that Plaintiffs give notice to William S. Hardey, George J. Hardey and Adeline Hardey, his wife, the adult non-resident defendants, parties named in these proceedings, of the substance and object of the same warning them and each of them to be and appear in this Court in person or by attorney on or before the 13th day of March, A.D. 1909, to answer said Bill and proceedings, and show cause, if any they have, why a decree should not pass as
