the Said adjudication of the rights of your orator and the defendants with reference to the Said division line between their Said lands committed the repeated and vexatious trespass heretofore mentioned.

Therefore your orator prays for the following relief.

(1) That the Said defendants, and each of them, their and each of their, agents, servants and employees may be restrained by the injunction of your Honorable Court from further interfering with the construction and maintenance by your orator of the the aforesaid fence along the northern division line, as heretofore mentioned, between the lands of your orator, and the defendant.

(2) That your orator may have all such other and further relief as the case may require.

And your orator prays for the following process.

(1) That the writ of injunction may be issued out of your Honorable Court against the Said William A. Sappington, and Tony G. Looman, and each of them, and their and each of their, servants, agents and employees restraining, enjoining and strictly prohibiting them from interfering in any manner whatsoever with the reconstruction and maintenance by your orator of the division fence, heretofore mentioned, upon the location it has heretofore occupied between the lands of your orator and the defendant, and from tearing down or removing any portion of Said division fence.

(2) That the writ of Subpoena may issue in the usual form against the Said defendants, William A. Sappington and Tony G. Looman, residents of Frederick County, commanding them and each of them to be and appear in this Court on some certain day, to be named in Said writ, to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be herein passed.
