Writ of Injunction

State of Maryland, Frederick County, to-wit:

State of Maryland to

William A. Sappington and

Ferry G. Looman of Frederick County, Maryland.

Whereas a certain John L. Whitehill of said County, has this day filed in the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity his Bill of Complaint against said William A. Sappington and Ferry G. Looman stating therein that he the said John L. Whitehill is the owner of a certain parcel of land containing 1 A. 2 rods & 3 Square perches more or less, situated in Frederick County, Maryland conveyed to said Whitehill by William A. Sappington and wife by deed dated May 30, 1887, & recorded in Liber S. T. N. No. 582, Folio 95, one of Land Records of Frederick County - a copy of which is filed with said Bill as Exhibit No. 1, and that said parcel of land forms an integral part of a farm owned by said Whitehill situated in said County, conveyed to him by Charles H. Whitehill and others by deed dated April 1, 1882, and recorded in Liber W. F. No. 5, Folio 13, one of said Land Records the whole of said farm including said adjacent Lot of 1 acre 2 Rods & 3 Square perches, containing 83, some 1 Rod and 3 Square perches of land more or less, and that said parcel of land mentioned in Exhibit No. 1, was conveyed to said Whitehill in exchange for a parcel of land conveyed by him to the said William A. Sappington by deed dated May 30th 1887, and recorded among said Land Records, and the lines of the lands intended to be conveyed to said Whitehill by said deed to him from said Sappington & wife were located and established by the parties by agreement on the ground, and the said deed was executed for the purpose of consummating said agreement and location as to the lands intended thereby to be conveyed to said Whitehill, and that said Whitehill caused a fence to be erected along the northern line of said parcel of land
