Therefore we do hereby Command and Strictly enjoin, restrain and Prohibit you the said William A. Sappington and Amy G. Loman and each of you and each of your agents, servants and employees from further interfering with the Construction and maintenance of said Plaintiff John C. Whitehill of the aforesaid fence along the Northern division line as heretofore mentioned, between the lands of said Plaintiff and the said Defendant, until the further order of this Honorable Court in the said premises, be made known.
