That in pursuance of the decree passed in this cause, your petitioners advertised and sold at public sale the property described in the advertisement of sale annexed to the acknowledgment of purchase, filed as Exhibit No. 1, to the Trustees Report of Sale, filed on the 27th day of April 1896, and that said report and the sale therein reported was finally ratified and confirmed by your Honorable Court on the 1st day of June 1896.

That since the filing and ratification of said Report your petitioners find that they have made an error, in the quantity of land advertised and sold, and that the property advertised and sold in the lot, containing four acres, two rods and thirty square feet, and being the property therein described in said advertisement, is included in the property therein described as will appear from a plot of said lots herewith filed as Exhibit A, to this Petition, that Herman J. Smith, the purchaser of said lot, secondly described, is willing and has relinquished all claim to said lot, provided that the payment made by him said lot is refunded to him, and his said County, in writing is herewith, filed marked Exhibit B, to this Petition.
