and said property conveyed to your Oratrix, as aforesaid, for life and after her death to her children. Her husband, Thomas P. Mullinix, was living and said property was then and for some time prior thereto had been the home of your Oratrix and her family, but subsequent thereto the health of her said husband failed and he was unable longer to contribute to the support of his family, the burden of which devolved upon your Oratrix who removed with her said family to Frederick City in the belief she could there better care for her invalid husband and infant children, and where her said husband afterwards died and as she is now a widow,

3. That she has been unable to secure satisfactory tenants for said property or give it personal supervision and it is getting out of repair and depreciating in value and there is danger of its further depreciation and loss and she believes and charges it would be greatly to the interest benefit and advantage of her self and her children for said real estate to be sold and the proceeds further invested under the order of your Honorable Court, for the benefit of your Oratrix for life and after her death for her children.

4. That she now has living the following children, all of whom are infants under the age of twenty one years, viz. Mary J. Shank, formerly Mary B. Mullinix, who has recently married William J. Shank, Sidonia Louise Mullinix, Alice Le Mullinix, Joseph B. Mullinix and William Edward Baker Mullinix, all of whom reside in Frederick County.

And your Oratrix prays for the following relief:-

1. That a decree may be passed by your Honorable Court for the sale of said real estate by a trustee to be appointed by such decree and the proceeds thereof afterwards invested as your Honor shall direct.

2. That process may be issued in the usual form against said Mary B. Shank, Sidonia Louise Mullinix, Alice Le Mullinix, Joseph B. Mullinix, William E. Baker Mullinix and said William J. Shank, an adult, all of Frederick County.

3. That your Oratrix may have all such other and further relief to which she may be entitled, she will ever pray &c.
