To the Honorable the Judge of said Court. The joint and several answers of Elizabeth Flook and Dawson F. Flook, her husband, Edmer Loub and Bettie Loub, to the Bill of Complaint of Laura E. Lattman and William H. Lattman her husband, against these respondents and others in this cause filed on Dec 22, 1908.

These defendants answering say:—

1st. These defendants admit the allegations contained in the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th paragraphs of said Bill as substantially correct.

2nd. These defendants admit the allegations contained in the 5th paragraph of said Bill in so far as said paragraph states that all parties to the aforesaid cause are all the persons who at this time are interested in the four parcels of real estate mentioned in said Bill but deny that they are all the persons that could be interested at some future time in the aforesaid real estate or in the proceeds that might arise from the sale thereof.

3rd.
