And the jurors aforesaid do also find, that the said Ignatius Thompson has an interest in the real estate of which a certain Elizabeth Thompson and a certain George Thompson, both late of Frederick County, deceased, did seized and possessed, of the value of one thousand dollars or more, but the exact value thereof, they are unable at this time ascertain, nor do they find that he hath, when in such unsound state of mind, alienated any part thereof.

And the jurors do also find that the nearest of kin to the said Ignatius Thompson, Clara V. Mild, Cora Powell, and Gertrude Mild, his sisters, all of whom are of age.
