Wm. B. of Frederick, and then Mr Daniel Blumauer turned over to me \$94<sup>50</sup> money that was found in the house belonging to Wm. H. Fry at the time of his death, in addition to those two amounts. I collected \$10. upon a note for \$30<sup>13</sup> signed by Geo. E. Funk et al. and trying to collect the balance. After a diligent search and inquiry this is all the personal estate left by Wm. H. Fry that has come to my sight or knowledge, and this aggregate amount will be wholly insufficient to pay the claims that have been filed against the estate, and the Costs of Administration upon the same. Wm. H. Fry's Estate owes to Hammaker & Muger the sum of \$44. and to Mr J. Smith for funeral expenses \$34<sup>75</sup> as is evidenced by Exhibits #1. and 2. Herwick filed with Examiner, Mr T. E. A. Miller, has filed with Examiner a note or Single Bill in the Orphan's Court, against the Estate of Wm. H. Fry, for more than three hundred dollars, and Daniel Blumauer & wife, have presented quite a large bill for services rendered against this Estate, but their claim the Orphan's Court has refused to pass. Now Mr. Harry J. Fahney has filed on the claim sheet of the Circuit Court, for Frederick County, a claim for \$52<sup>00</sup>. I have heard the testimony of Wm. H. Smith previously given in this case and from all the information that I have been able to get his testimony as to the heirs of Phebe Ann Fry, deceased is correct as given by him, and the Bill of Complaint, they were all made parties defendant in this cause, and have all filed their answer therein consenting to a sale of the real Estate described in Exhibit #4. Excepting Eugene Mandy, against whom a decree pro Confesso, has been granted by this Court, under all the circumstances it will be necessary to sell the real estate described in Exhibit #4, as the personalty is wholly insufficient to pay even the Bills that have already been brought in against the estate.
