Little executed the note and mortgage securing the same, both of which are dated Nov. 23-1882, and are filed and which are filed with the Bill marked Exhibit I & C, respectively. For value received I took all of the note and mortgage for \$2002 and interest from Helen K. Kershberger, Guardian of the Estate of Kershberger as will appear from said instrument filed ^{Nov} I am in possession of and claim the entire interest in said real estate under the terms of my mother's will and the deed of John Erwin Howard.

At the time of my mother's death she also left a son Truman W. Little who died in January 1890, leaving surviving him:-

1. Son John E. Little now married to Florence L. Little, who resides in Washington County, Md.
2. Son Albert W. Little now married to Mattie J. Little who reside in Frederick County,

3. Daughter Lenora Jane Martin, married to Mahlon Martin who reside in Balt. Co. Md.
4. Daughter Annie M. Little unmarried and now residing in Harrisburg, Tenn.

Also a son named William Scott Little who is unmarried, now residing in Balt. Co. Md. also a daughter Florence Amanda Little now dead leaving surviving her a son Marion L. Little who is unmarried, residing in Frederick Co. Md. and also surviving her the said Florence Amanda Little a daughter Nellie K. Geyer, married to Frank Geyer residing in Washington County,

Truman W. Little also have a daughter Sarah W. Smith who died Dec. 27-1880, leaving surviving her a son Clara A. Smith and a daughter, Flora M. Peters, married to Mortimer T. Peters, these last named three reside at or near Spomer Point, in Balt. City, Md.

There was also surviving my mother Sarah Little, my brother John Scott Little who died in January 1892, leaving surviving him a son John Roy Little, married to Samantha K. Little who now reside in Washington County, Md. and a daughter Ida E. Little, also called Birdie V. Little, who at the time of the filing of this Bill resided in Washington Co. Md.

All of said parties aforementioned are adults over 21 years of age.

The said real estate is not susceptible of division among the parties named or of any division at all because it is a small village property
