I further devise and bequeath that after the death of my dear devoted wife Maria Alexander that my Executor shall divide all of my property, real personal and mixed equally between my children and Sister if living share and share alike, and pay the same over to them each child their share, except my daughter Ella wife of Martin Flook and my son Peter Alexander whose share shall be invested by a trustee appointed by Court having jurisdiction thereof, and they shall receive the interest thereof until their children arrive of age when the same shall be paid over to them or their heirs or assigns.

And Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint John D. Akell to be executor of this my last will and testament, revoking and annulling all former wills by me heretofore made, ratifying and confirming this and none other, to be my last will and testament.
