Maryland, on Cash Patrick Street, and that the said William S. Miller left surviving him the following heirs at law, viz: - Virginia B. Miller (his widow), and an adult daughter Corlieu M. Ford, who resides in New York City, and whose husband is deceased; an adult son George H. Miller whose wife's name is Julia F. Miller, both of whom reside Quincy, Illinois; an adult daughter Isabel M. Martin whose husband's name is William W. Martin both of whom are residents of Kingston, New York; an adult son Daniel B. Miller, who died on or about the 18th day of January, 1910, intestate leaving surviving him a widow whose name is Harriet Miller and an infant son whose name is Charles S. Miller, both of whom reside in the City of Washington D. C. and the following named children of an adult daughter who was deceased at the time of the death of the said William S. Miller, all of which said children are adults, viz: - James Menegre whose wife's name is Andrea Menegre and who resides in New York City, and Martin L. Lavin whose husband's name is George Lavin both of whom reside in Philadelphia Pennsylvania.

The Bill further states, That the house upon the premises has for sometime been unoccupied, and is producing no income and that it would be to the benefit and advantage of the infant Charles S. Miller to sell said real estate and to invest his share of the proceeds for his benefit; and also, that said real estate is not susceptible of partition without loss and injury to the parties entitled to interests therein, and that in order to make division of said interests, it will be necessary that said real estate be sold and the proceeds divided amongst the parties according to their several interests.

And, the Bill prays for the following relief; - That a decree may be passed for a sale of said real estate, that the proceeds of said sale may be divided amongst the Complainants, and the defendants according to their respective rights and interests, and for General Relief.

It is thereupon this 2nd day of February A. D. 1910. Ordered by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, Maryland, sitting as a Court of Equity, and by the authority thereof, that the Complainants, by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper published in said Frederick County, once in each of four successive weeks
