To the Honorable Judges of Said Court:-
 The Bill of Complaint of Sarah E. Cooley of Frederick
 County, Maryland, who files this Bill as well for
 herself, as for all other creditors of John W. Cooley, late
 of Frederick County, deceased, who may come in and
 contribute to the expense of this Suit, respectfully shews
 unto your Honors:-

1st. That John W. Cooley, late of Frederick County,
 Maryland, departed this life on or about the 19th
 day of January 1906, intestate, and indebted to your
 Oratrix on claims existing in the life time of the decea-
 sed, in the full and just sum of \$671.20, \$271.20 being
 for money loaned, and money paid and for other
 things properly chargeable in account, as well as
 the sum of \$400.00 paid on accounts of a certain
 Mortgage and Note payable to a certain Louisa E.
 Haid, and signed by the said John W. Cooley and
 your oratrix, said Mortgage having been given to
 secure the balance of the purchase price of said land,
 and premises mentioned in said Mortgage, the deed having
 been made to the said John W. Cooley, said indebtedness
 being evidenced by your oratrix Account and Mortgage
 Note herewith filed as part hereof and marked Exhibits S.E.
 C. and C.E.O.

2nd. That the personal estate of the said John W. Cooley
 deceased, is insufficient, and was insufficient at the
 time of his death to pay his debts, due and owing at
 the time of his death, and the proper costs of administration
 and that the whole of said sum of \$671.20 due your oratrix,
 is still due and unpaid, as well as the other claims of
 creditors of the said John W. Cooley.

3rd. That the said John W. Cooley, late of Frederick County
 being indebted as aforesaid unto your oratrix and also
 to various other persons, departed this life on or about
 the 19th day of January 1906, intestate, and seized in fee
 in his own right at the time of his death of a certain
 tract of land and Real-estate containing 32 acres more or
 less, situated in Quakertown District Frederick County
