1<sup>st</sup>. Are you or not acquainted with the parties to this Suit, or either or which of them? and how long have you known them?

2<sup>nd</sup>. Were you or not acquainted with ~~one~~ John Poutjahn of G. formerly a resident of Frederick County? Is he dead or alive; if dead when and where did he die?

3<sup>rd</sup>. Did said John Poutjahn of G. leave a widow now living? If yes what is her name, & where does she live?

4<sup>th</sup>. Do you do you not know the lands of which said John Poutjahn of G. died seized & possessed. If yes look at the Exhibits now shown you, did you die seized and possessed of the Property described in said Exhibits. State fully all your Knowledge therein.

5<sup>th</sup>. Did, or did not the said John Poutjahn of G. die intestate? If so give the names ages of all his children or heirs at law, to the best of your Knowledge and their present places of residence.
