I also give and bequeath to my Son William McBride my undivided interest in a tract of land conveyed by Martin McBride & Elizabeth McBride, his wife, to myself Mary McBride and Elizabeth McBride, by a deed bearing date on the 27th day of March A.D. 1868 and recorded in Liber 6, No. 2, folio 126, being one of the Land Records for Frederick County, by reference to said deed will more fully and at large appear - said lands lying and being in Frederick County Maryland. I have bequeathed the above lands to the aforesaid William McBride and his heirs in fee simple with full power to executor to make any necessary conveyance to carry out the same.

I also bequeath my Son William McBride all my personal property of every description including household and kitchen furniture, meaning hereby to include all my personal property.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my Son Martin McBride to be sole executor of this my last will and Testament revoking and annulling all wills by me heretofore made, ratifying and confirming this and none other to be my last will and Testament.
