Decree pro Confesso and
 Courts Order to Take
 testimony

To the Honorable, the Judges of Said Court.
 The defendants Abraham McBride and Matilda
 McBride, his wife Elizabeth Boyer and Jacob Boyer, her
 husband, Mary Bowdler Cooper, Gertrude Cooper, Dennis
 Cooper, Frederick Grimes, Rufus Grimes and Ethel
 Grimes, his wife having been duly summoned to appear
 to the Bill of Complaint, and having failed to appear
 thereto the Plaintiffs pray for the following relief, that
 a decree pro Confesso may be taken and passed
 against them the said defendant and for such
 other and further relief as the case may require.

It also appearing from the proceedings in this
 cause that the order of Publication heretofore issued
 therein has been duly published in The Valley Reg-
 istry, a newspaper published at Middletown,

 McFarland, and James McFarland Martin Grimes and
 Grimes, having failed to appear either in person
