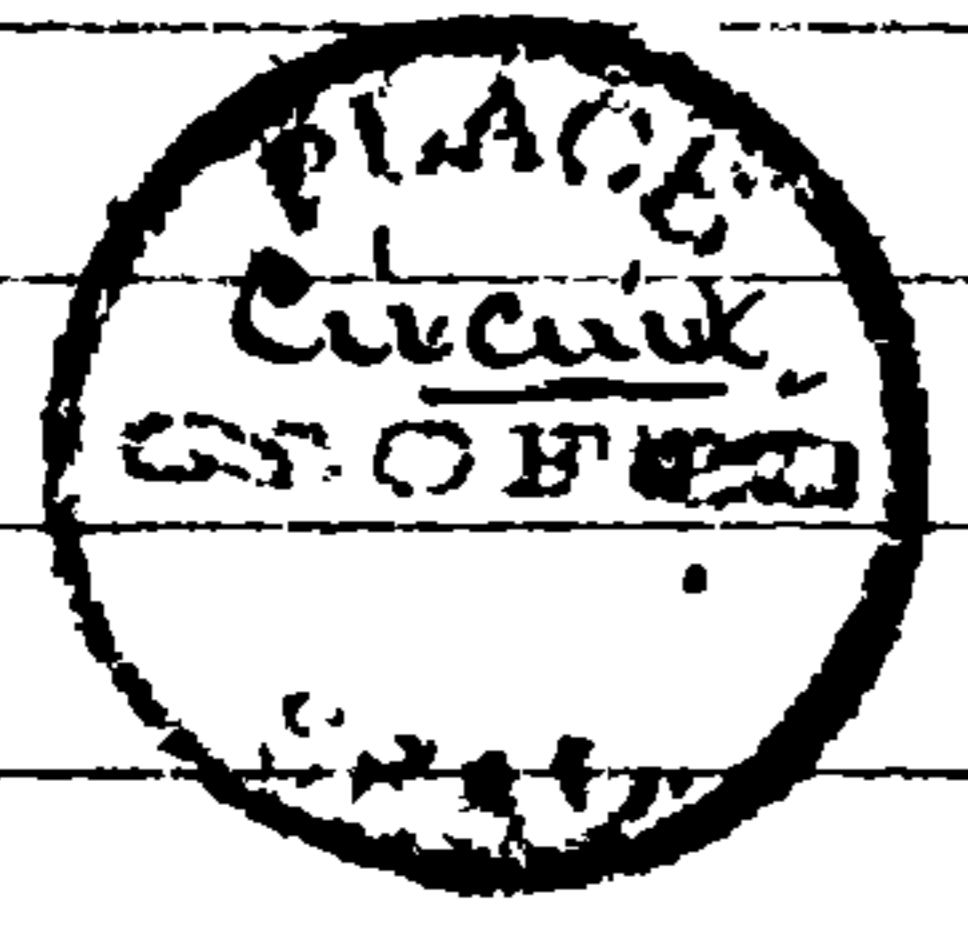

This deed made on this 14th day of May in the year a.d. 1897, by me F. Marion Finkle Trustee, Witnesseth Whereas by a decree of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity passed on the 26th day of May A.D. 1896, in the case of Annie S. Finkhart widow &c., plaintiff vs. George W. Finkhart et al. doers and unto being No. 5816 Equity docket of said Court, the said F. Marion Finkle was appointed Trustee to sell the land decreed to be sold and has sold the same or part thereof to Joseph W. Garver at and for the sum of twenty three dollars who has fully paid the purchase money therefor.

Now therefore in consideration of the premises, the said F. Marion Finkle Trustee, do grant unto the said Joseph W. Garver all the right and title of all the parties to the aforesaid cause to all that tract of land with improvements thereon called "Chestnut Hollow" situated lying and being in Frederick County, State of Maryland, containing one acre of land more or less and being the same land that was conveyed to William Finkhart by Elizabeth Crum Margaret A. Crum and others by deed dated February 23rd A.D. 1850 and recorded in Liber F.S. No. 7, folio 534 one of the Land Records of Frederick County, all of which will more fully appear by reference thereto.
