At the request of Thomas S. Thrasher the following deed is received for Record and recorded Oct. 17th 1883 at 4:10 O'clock P. M. Test. Adolphus Fearhake, Jr. Clk.

This deed made this seventeenth day of October in the year Eighteen hundred and Eighty three. Witnesseth that I Sarah H. Kessler, Executrix of the last Will and Testament of Israel Kessler late of Frederick County, State of Maryland. Deceased under a power in said Will contained in Consideration of the sum of Nine Thousand Nine hundred and Ninety eight $\frac{3}{100}$ Dollars have bargained and sold to Thomas S. Thrasher of the County and State of Maryland, being part of a tract of land called "Cut knee" and part of tract of land called "Fielders Manor" beginning so as to include the whole in one entire at a large stone formerly planted and standing at the beginning of the deed from Lewis P. McPate and Solomon Kurap, Trustees in Equity No. 840, to Andrew Kessler, Sr. and running thence with the first line thereof, South fifty seven and a half degrees, East forty seven and a half perches to the end of the first line and three quarter degrees East nineteen perches to the middle of the Public Road leading from the Point of Rocks to Jefferson thence with the middle of said and the 2nd line of the aforesaid deed, North thirty one degrees East Eighty two perches to the end of twenty three perches on the second line of the deed from Tackett Wells to Andrew Kessler, Sr., recorded in Liber N. R. No. 10, folio 180, DC. and running thence with said second line, South seventy four degrees East forty five perches to a stone formerly called "Cut knee" and with the said line reversed, North sixty two degrees East 4 and two thirds perches to a stone formerly planted at the end of four and a quarter perches on the
