plat of the Survey made by William C. Hunt, on or about Dec-  
ember, 1909.

My brother, Thomas, myself, brother and sisters agreed  
upon an exchange of 11 acres and 33 square perches of land from  
each property as shown by Exhibit Z. This exchange was  
was agreed upon in order to make a better alignment  
between the respective farms, or pieces of the land, which  
were so very close to the buildings on each property.  
I together with my brother, John R. Thrasher, Mr. H. H. H. H.  
Thrasher and Mr. Theresa Thrasher, are the owners of  
the farm adjoining that mentioned in Exhibits Y, and  
Z, and is correctly described by the Certified Copy of  
a deed, which is now shown me marked Exhibit A.

In these proceedings,

There has never been an exchange of deeds for the several  
parcels agreed to be exchanged although each of the parties,  
to wit: brother Thomas and ourselves, immediately after  
the execution of the deed Exhibit A, took possession of  
the parcels intended to be exchanged and removed the  
fencing as it was originally around said original tracks  
and placed the fencing on the lines now shown as  
the outlines of the two farms shown on plat Exhibit  
Z. There were some other little changes that had been  
proposed by brother Thomas which were intended to  
be made before the deeds of exchange were made,  
but he died before accomplishing either.

Myself and sisters are ready and willing to  
execute a proper deed of conveyance to the heirs at law  
of Thomas S. Thrasher for the portion taken by said exchange  
from our property upon the execution of a proper deed  
of conveyance by some duly authorized to convey a similar  
amount from the estate of the said Thomas S. Thrasher.

It is of great benefit and advantage to the minor  
children of the said Thomas S. Thrasher that the said  
deed of exchange be made as originally agreed upon  
between the parties the land in each instance in my  
judgment being of equal value.
