The Petition of the Board of Home Missions of the Reformed in the United States, a Body Corporate, duly incorporated under the laws of the State of Pennsylvania, respectfully shown unto your Honors: -

- 1st. That by the provisions of the last Will and Testament of Josephus Song, a certified copy of which is filed in this cause as Exhibit "A" to the Bill, he gave to his wife the power to "devise" by Will six thousand dollars of his estate to "Whomsoever she will",
