Certified Copy of Bill of Complaint and decree from Circuit Court of Baltimore City.

Filed Dec 25-1911.

To the Honorable, The Judge of said Court: The Bill of Complaint of Milton H. Cannon and Margaret S. Cannon, his wife, Cecelia Phillips and Julian F. Phillips her husband; and Myrtle W. Cannon widow of Thomas Harris Cannon late of Baltimore City deceased, respectfully shows:

1. That Thomas J. Cannon the father of four Orators, Myrtle W. Cannon, died in the City of Baltimore on or about the 7th day of February, 1910, intestate, leaving surviving him his widow, the Defendant Eleanor Cannon, and three children four Orators, Milton H. Cannon and Cecelia Phillips and another son, Thomas Harris Cannon who survived his said father, but has since died intestate on the 29th day of January, 1911, leaving surviving him his widow, one Orator, Myrtle W. Cannon, and one child, the infant Defendant Eleanor W. Cannon now aged about 11 years.

2. That said Thomas J. Cannon left some considerable personal property more than sufficient to pay and discharge all claims against his estate, and also died seized and possessed of considerable Real Estate within this State, the greater part thereof being situated in the City of Baltimore, a part thereof also situated in Baltimore County, and a part thereof in Frederick County as follows: (1) a lot of ground in the City of Baltimore beginning at the northeast corner of Fulton Avenue and Mulberry Street and running thence North on the east side of Fulton Avenue 2 1/2 feet and 1 inch, thence east parallel with Mulberry Street about 124 feet
