

No. 8792. Equity.

a. all that tract of land situate in Baltimore County on the Johnny Cake road at or near running land beginning at a stone heretofore planted on the north side of Johnny Cake road (sometimes called old Frederick Road), thence running with and bounding thereon the two courses South $53\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. 12 perches thence South $56\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. $9\frac{1}{10}$ perches to a stake thence N. $14\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. $23\frac{1}{10}$ perches thence N. $88\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. 6 perches thence N. 17° E. $44\frac{1}{10}$ perches to a stake planted by a fence thence along said fence S. $41\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W. $67\frac{1}{10}$ perches to the beginning containing 5 acres of land more or less which said Thomas J. Cannon acquired in fee by deed from Charles Herrald dated October 24th 1887, recorded among the said records of Baltimore City in Liber N. W. S. b. also the parcel of land adjoining (or included in the above described tract beginning at a granite stone with a square top standing at the corner of Herald's Lot, it being also a corner of Lamb's Lot and running thence N. $16\frac{1}{2}$ east 40 perches N. 55° W. 8 perches S. $16\frac{1}{2}$ W. 40 perches S. 55° E. 8 perches to the beginning containing about 2 acres of land, which said Thomas J. Cannon acquired in fee by deed from Peter Link and wife dated September 15th 1886, recorded among said said records for Baltimore County in Liber N. W. S. No. 120 folio 314 &c. which said deed is herewith filed marked Complainant's Exhibit No. 4.

(c) also the parcel of ground lying on the Johnny Cake Road immediately adjoining the first parcel above described sometimes known as the "Clark's Lot" of which said Thomas J. Cannon died seized and possessed and of which he had uninterrupted and exclusive possession for more than twenty years prior to his death.

(4) all these tracts of land, pieces or parcels of ground, situate and lying in Frederick County in this State at or near the Town of Brunswick, of which the said Thomas J. Cannon died seized and possessed consisting in part of the tracts or parcels of ground below mentioned and referred to, it being intended to include in these proceedings all the land so situate in Frederick County, belonging to said Thomas J.
