in Frederick County being part of a tract called The Resurvey of Maryland, being part of a tract called The Resurvey of Maryland being the same land that was conveyed to Caleb Ogleton by Jacob Ellen and wife, by deed dated April 9th 1837, recorded in Liber N. S. No. 4, folio 468 of the Land Records of Frederick County, beginning at the beginning as described in said deed, it being at the end of a line drawn N. 66° E. 3 perches from the center of a Spring thence with said line reversed 566 ³/₄ E. 3 perches to the center of said Spring, thence down the Spring branch as now surveyed the 29th day of June 1891, S. 62° E. 143 ¹/₄ perches then with the dividing line as we now find it S. 24° E. 19 ¹/₄ perches, N. 70° E. 19 ¹/₄ perches to a stone at the roots of a hickory tree with twelve chops thence N. 88° E. 57 ¹/₄ perches to the beginning 5 ⁷/₈ acres, more or less, which said Thomas J. Cannon acquired in fee by deed from John Ogleton, et al. dated July 10th 1891, and recorded among the Land Records of N. S. P. No. 13, folio 613 re. which said deed is herewith filed marked "Complainants Exhibit No. 5."

(b.) All those pieces or parcels of ground situate in Frederick County which were acquired in fee by said Thomas J. Cannon by deed from the Mutual Land and Improvement Company dated February 21st 1906 and recorded among the Land Records for said County in Liber S. T. H. No. 274, folio 80 re. which said deed is herewith filed marked "Complainants Exhibit No. 6" to which reference is hereby made for a full description of said lots or parcels of ground; saving and excepting such plots or parcels thereof as may have been sold and conveyed by said Thomas J. Cannon in his life time.

(c.) All that tract or parcel of land situate in Frederick County on the Public road leading from Brunswick to Petersville, containing about 20 ⁹⁷/₁₀₀ acres of land, shown by the Plat thereof made by Crum & Davidson, Surveyors of September 30th 1910, which said Plat is herewith annexed marked "Complainants Exhibit No. 7, and hereby made part of this Bill of Complaint. Said land being supposed to be included in the deeds above mentioned and herewith filed, or in such deeds as may hereafter be filed if necessary.

It being intended to include in these proceedings all of the land in Frederick County near the town of Brunswick of which the said Thomas J. Cannon died seized and possessed of what was generally known as distinguished as his "Farm property" and the
