2nd - That the said Margaret E. Miller was at the date of said deed Exhibit "M. E. M." or being the first A. D. 1874, the wife of George T. Miller, 3rd. - That the said Margaret E. Miller departed this life intestate, or or about the month of May A. D. 1884, leaving surviving her, her said husband George T. Miller and the following children as her heirs at law, as follows to wit: - an adult unmarried daughter Cora May Miller who resides in Frederick County, Maryland; an adult daughter, Annie F. Eyles whose husband's name is Henry Eyles both of whom reside in Frederick County, Maryland; an adult son Frank A. Miller who is unmarried and who resides in Baltimore, Maryland, and an adult son George M. Miller, whose wife's name is Claude Miller both of whom are now residents of the State of Maryland residing in the State of Illinois. The said Cora May Miller Frank A. Miller, Annie F. Eyles and Henry her husband and George M. Miller and Claude Miller his wife being the parties Plaintiff herein; and the said Ella S. Miller being one of the Defendants herein for reasons hereinafter set forth.

4th - That the said George T. Miller as the surviving husband of the said Margaret E. Miller who departed this life intestate or or about the month of May A. D. 1884, became entitled to and enjoyed under the laws of the State of Maryland as codified in the year A. D. 1860, until his decease in the month of May A. D. 1908, a life estate in the land mentioned in and conveyed to his wife Margaret E. Miller by the deed filed herewith as Exhibit "M. E. M."

5th. That the said George T. Miller in or about the year 1887, intermarried with one Catherine S. Eyles and subsequently about the month of August A. D. 1887, conveyed to his said wife Catherine S. Miller his life estate in the land mentioned and conveyed to Margaret E. Miller in the deed Exhibit "M. E. M."; and that subsequently thereto or or about the month of April A. D. 1900, the said George T. Miller and Catherine S. Miller his wife being indebted to one Charles A. Norwood in the sum of \$200.00 executed and delivered to the said Charles A. Norwood the promissory note of their said indebtedness, as will appear by a duly certified copy of said mortgage herewith filed and marked Exhibit "C. A. N.". And your Orators and Oratrices aver and charge that the said mortgage was a valid lien on said real estate, because your

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
