end of forty six and a half perches on the first  
 line of the whole tract called the "Resurvey or  
 Ridgelys Past" and running thence with said line  
 North two hundred and twenty one and a half  
 perches to the end of said line, then North forty  
 eight and a Quarter degrees East fifty perches  
 to the end of the tenth line of "Kestel Ridgely  
 Sur" part of said land, then by and with the  
 same reversed three courses East thirty four perches,  
 South twenty five degrees East forty perches, South sixty  
 degrees East forty four perches then South fifteen and
