- Q. Did any one ever use the lot in any way after Mr. Crampton got possession of it other than Mr. Crampton?
- A. Not that I know of.
- Q. You lived right close to it, did you not?
- A. Yes Sir, adjoining it.
- Q. What is the value of this lot, Mr. Holt?
- A. At one time it was very valuable but he cut the house and barn which he built on his farm off of this lot, I do not know of its value now.
- Q. What other lot did he own?
- A. He owned another lot situated near Mt Philip School House in Fellingner District.
- Q. Show me a certified copy of a deed from Sylvia A. Stone to Joshua Crampton, bearing date the 23rd day of May, in the year 1885, and recorded in Liber A. T. No. 11, folio 167, one of the Sand Records of Frederick County, please state whether this is a certified copy of the deed for said lot to Mr. Crampton and whether it correctly describes the lot.
- A. I look at the deed and it correctly describes this property.
- Q. What in your judgment is this worth?
- A. I haven't seen the lot for sometime and I do not know exactly what it is worth. It adjoins Charles Olive.
