Petition of Dr. G. Wilmer Gouster  
 to be made Party  
 Plaintiff, and the Court's  
 Order thereon.

To the Honorable, the Judge of the Circuit Court,  
 for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity,  
 The petition of Dr. G. Wilmer Gouster respectfully  
 represents unto your Honor:-

1st. That in the filing of the bill of Com-  
 plaint in the above entitled Cause, in which your  
 petitioner, Dr. G. Wilmer Gouster, prays for a  
 certain relief, he, the said Dr. G. Wilmer G. Gouster,  
 was through error not made a party Plaintiff  
 to the Bill.

2nd. That the relief prayed for in said bill  
 is that the property mentioned therein may be sold  
 and the claims of your petitioner and others who  
 may come in and contribute to the costs of the  
 proceedings may be paid and the residue divided  
 among the proper heirs at law of William W.  
 Baer.

3rd. That since the filing of the Bill of

4th. That in order that the title to the property

 in order that your petitioner, who prays for relief in  
 said Cause, may be a party thereto, it is necessary that  
 your petitioner may be a party plaintiff to the said  
 Cause and that the Roy C. Murtz husband of the said  
 Stella Baer, may be a party defendant thereto.

Wherefore, your petitioner respectfully petitions your  
 Honorable Court that he, the said Dr. G. Wilmer Gouster  
 may be made a party plaintiff to the aforesaid  
 Cause, and that Roy C. Murtz may be made a  
 party defendant to the said Cause.
