Ques. She is dead. She died February 1911.

6 Sub. Was the said Wm M. Baer, in poor health prior to his death and if yes for how long a period of time?

Ans. He was in poor health for two years immediately preceding his death. He was afflicted with paralysis.

7 Sub. Who was his physician during this time and has he been paid for his services?

Ans. Dr. J. Wilbur Tourter, he has not been paid for his services for Wm M. Baer told me.

8 Sub. Was the said William M. Baer at the time of death seized and possessed of any real estate?

Ans. Yes.

9th Sub. of what did it consist?

Ans. He owned a piece or pieces of ground containing three acres improved with a two story log house, and situate in Frederick County Maryland.

10 Sub. Will you look at the paper now shown you marked "Exhibit B" and state what the same is?

Ans. It is a certified copy of the deed for the above property from William Kauffman & wife and correctly describes the same.

Paper herewith filed with the Examiner marked "Exhibit B" as evidence in this cause.

11 Sub. Prior to the execution of the above instrument "Exhibit B" to-wit: - on the 19th day of May 1883, was there any incumbrance on said property and if yes what was it?

Ans. Yes William Kauffman and Annie Kauffman his wife, executed a mortgage conveying the property mentioned in "Exhibit B" conveying the property to Martin L. Goussier, my father, for the securing the payment of the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00).

12 Sub. Look at the paper now shown you marked "Exhibit C" and state what the same is?

Ans. It is the original mortgage from William Kauffman & wife, to my father Martin L. Goussier.

Paper herewith filed with the Examiner marked "Exhibit C" as evidence in this cause.

13th. Has the mortgage debt evidenced by said "Exhibit C" or any part thereof been paid?

Ans. To the best of my knowledge two hundred and fifty dollars is still due and owing with interest at 5% from May 19-1883, under the mortgage.

14th. Did the said Wm M. Baer leave, at the time of his decease, any personal property?

Ans. Nothing of any value.

15th. Did the said Wm M. Baer, at the time of his
