

No. 8627, Equity.

To the Honorable the Judge of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity etc. That they have collected most of the assets of said Corporation, and have, under the orders of your Honorable Court, heretofore passed in this Cause, distributed to the Creditors of said Savings Bank, moneys which they have collected, to the extent of fifty-eight and one-third per cent (58 1/3%) of the respective claims of said Creditors, leaving a small balance still in the hands of your Petitioners, etc. That the remaining assets of said Bank will not yield more than sufficient to pay from three to ten per cent additional, to the Creditors of said Bank, on their respective claims.

But, That the greater portion of said assets consist of the real estate owned by said Bank, in the town of Brunswick.

And, That your receiver still have on hand, in addition to said real estate, all unimproved lot of in the town of Brunswick, which was conveyed to them by William Schnauffer, the Treasurer of said Savings Bank, and also ten (10) shares of Piedmont Mercantile & Depositing Co., Fifty Shares (50) of the Red Mill Building & Construction Co. of Brunswick, two (2) shares of the Harpers' Ferry Electric Light and Power Co., Twenty-two (22) shares of the Berlin & Lovettsville Bridge Co., ten (10) shares of the Brunswick Furniture Co. four (4) shares Red Dragon Selzer Co., Common Stock; six (6) shares of the Red Dragon Selzer Co. preferred stock; three (3) shares of the Brunswick Canning Co.; 1 share (1) of the Brunswick Athletic Association, Stocks which formerly belonged to said William Schnauffer, which were turned over to your receiver, and your receiver still has on hand, the (40) Forty Shares of the Frederick County National Bank, which stand in the name of the Savings Bank of Brunswick, and in addition certain fixtures, chattels, and equipment, which were found on the premises of said said Savings Bank of Brunswick and in addition, certain fixtures, chattels, and equipment, which were found on the premises of said Savings Bank.

And, That in the order of your Honorable Court, heretofore passed on the 13th day of January, in the year 1911, the question of the disposition of the property owned by said Savings Bank and the dissolution of said Corporation, were reserved by your Honorable Court for future determination.

And, That in the judgment of your Petitioners, it is now desirable that your Honor should pass a decree adjudging said Savings Bank of Brunswick, dissolving said Corporation, and, empowering and directing your Petitioners
