Fourth Report of Sale.

To the Honorable, the Judge of said Court.  
The Report of Private Sale of Thomas A. Murray,  
Trustee, in this cause respectfully shows:

That having given approved bond with  
security, as required by the decree in this cause, and  
being by the terms of said decree authorized to sell  
any or all of the property mentioned could by law  
to the best advantage at private sale, your trustee now  
reports that he has sold at private sale, subject to  
the approval and ratification of this court, unto  
Howard Marvin Jones, at and for the sum of Forty  
Five Hundred dollars (\$4500), cash upon the ratification  
of said sale, the property mentioned in these proceedings  
remaining unsold, being the property, situate in Harford  
County in the State of or near the town of Brainerd  
of which Thomas J. Cannon late of the City, died seized  
and possessed, mentioned and intended to be included  
in these proceedings, consisting of the tract or parcel  
of land containing about 2097/100 acres shown by the survey  
and Plat filed in these proceedings (Complainant's Exhibit  
No. 7.) known as the "Farm Property" and the adjacent  
property subdivided into lots with projected streets and  
alleys as shown on the additional Plat filed in  
these proceedings of which said Thomas J. Cannon  
died seized and possessed, said sale being intended  
to include all the property, so as aforesaid, situate  
which was acquired in fee by deed from Thomas  
J. Cannon and wife in Liber H. J. B. No. 11, folio 473,  
etc of said Land Records; a copy of which said  
Plat is filed in these proceedings above mentioned.
