

W.O. & C. Equity

Third, That the said Charles F. Gernand died and the said Fannie E. Gernand his wife executed unto Charles A. Norwood a confessed judgment on said bond for the sum of six thousand dollars on the 4th day of January, A.D. 1911, which judgment remains unpaid with interest from January 4th A.D. 1911, a certified copy of which judgment is filed herewith as part thereof and marked "Exhibit B".

4. That the said Real Estate descended to the said infant defendants subject to the power of said widow and said judgment lien.

5th. That said real estate cannot be divided among the said infant defendants without loss and injury to them and that it will be to the interest, benefit and advantage of the infant defendants to have said bond sold under a decree of said Court, and to have the proceeds of sale divided among them according to their respective interests therein.

To the end, therefore, that the said Fannie E. Gernand, widow, Harry I. Gernand, Amy G. Gernand, Russell H. Gernand, Ruth E. Gernand and Charles Preston Gernand, infants and Charles A. Norwood, defendants may answer the premises.

(2) That a decree may be passed by said Court for the sale of said Real Estate.

(3) That the proceeds of sale may be distributed among the parties to this cause according to their respective interests therein.

4. That the Plaintiff may have such other and further relief as her case may require.

May it please Your Honorable Court to grant to your said plaintiff the writ of subpoena against the said Fannie E. Gernand widow and Harry I. Gernand, Amy G. Gernand, Russell H. Gernand, Ruth E. Gernand and Charles Preston Gernand infants and Charles A. Norwood defendants, all of Frederick County, Maryland commanding them to appear in this Court at some certain day to be therein named to answer the premises and to abide by and perform such decree as may be passed therein.
