of Charles A. Woodward.

The defendant, Charles A. Woodward, demurs to the Plaintiff's Bill and for cause of demurrer shows:-

1. That the Plaintiff has not stated in her Bill such a case as entitles her to any relief in Equity against this defendant.

2. That it appears by the Bill that the same is exhibited against this defendant and other defendants, therein for several and distinct matters and causes, in some thereof, as appears by the Bill, this defendant is in no way interested or concerned, and that this Bill is multifarious.

3. That this defendant is the holder of a mortgage on the real estate mentioned in these proceedings executed by a certain Josiah Engler and by said Engler delivered to this defendant and by this defendant placed on record December 22nd, A.D. 1900, in Liber 20. N. N. No. 10, Folio 367, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, that said mortgage is in default.
