He died intestate on February 10-1911 at his home in Frederick County, and left a widow Fannie E. Gorman, who is 46 years of age and reside in Frederick County, and the following children as his only heirs at law, viz: Harry L. Gorman, Amy L. Gorman, Russell H. Gorman, Ruth P. Gorman and Charles Preston Gorman, all of whom are infants under 21 years of age and reside in Frederick County, Maryland.

The said Charles E. Gorman was at the time of his death seized and possessed of a farm containing 162 Acres and 28 perches of land, more or less, situate in Johnsons District in Frederick County, Maryland, and which is the same land which was conveyed to the said Charles E. Gorman by Joint Deed, by deed dated July 11<sup>th</sup> 1910. a certified copy of which deed is now shown me and filed herein and marked Exhibit A. Said land is worth about \$8000.
