

Q. No. 8845, Equity.

- A. I do not know.
- Q. Did you have anything to do with the disposition of any personal property that was said to belong to Daniel B. Larrison or his wife, Elizabeth Larrison after their death? And if so, of what did that property consist. How did you get it and what disposition did you make of it?
- A. I did; it consisted principally of household goods. This property was brought to Harpsville and I was asked to sell it as agent for the heirs at public sale. I didn't have anything to do with bringing the property to Harpsville.
- Q. Who asked you to sell it?
- A. Mr. Victor Kline and his wife, Tamara Kline.
- Q. Did they say whose property it was?
- A. They claimed it was the property of Mrs. Larrison.
- Q. How did they sell it?
- A. At public sale.
- Q. What did the sale amount to?
- A. The sale that day amounted to about \$130.00 perhaps \$135.00 the entire sale of that day which included a number of articles belonging to Mrs. Kline, Blacksmith tools, and things of that character sold there that day. In my judgment the property of Mrs. Larrison did not bring more than approximately \$120.00 I am sure I am high enough for that.
- Q. What disposition was made of the proceeds of that sale?
- A. A bill of Mr. Larrison's to Alvin Harshman to the amount of \$5.00 was paid for corn which Mr. Larrison had purchased of him, a sum of about the same amount to Warrupety Barr was paid, the doctor's bill of Dr. A. J. Smith of \$50.00 was paid. Printing of the sale bill and auctioneer was paid. Printing of the sale bill and I do not know the exact amount at this time. The balance is in the First & Savings Bank at Myeroville with an understanding with Mr. & Mrs. Kline that that money be paid on the undertaker's bill.
- Q. What is the amount of the balance of the First & Savings Bank?
- A. I do not know, it would be in the neighborhood of \$50.00 I suppose, perhaps only \$40.00.
- Q. The Barlow note was given for the purchase of mules was not it?
- A. I had no understanding but haven't any positive knowledge.
