Cyrus F. Flood.

Jacob Mangius, a witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the Plaintiff, being duly sworn, deposes and says:-

Q. State your name, age, residence and occupation.

A. Jacob Mangius, a witness of lawful age; residence near Wolfsville, Frederick's County, Maryland.

Q. You know the parties to this suit, do you not?

A. I do.

Q. Did you know him (Daniel B. Brouse); is he living or dead; and if dead, when did he die?

A. I knew him, he is dead; he died last January.

Q. Look at the paper now handed you marked Exhibit A, and state what it is?

A. It is a Certified Copy of a deed from John W. Shutt, and Martha A. Shutt, his wife, to Daniel B. Brouse 2 1/2 Acres of land, more or less.

Q. What in your judgment is this property worth?

A. Well, I will say \$600.00.

Q. When did Daniel B. Brouse die.

A. The latter part of January, 1912.

Q. Whom did he leave surviving him?

A. His wife, Elizabeth B. Brouse, and a daughter Ella Myers, whose husband's name is Marshall Myers.

Q. How long did Mrs. Brouse survive her husband?

A. From Tuesday night at about 10 o'clock until Friday noon.

Q. Look at the paper now handed you marked Exhibit D, and state what the same is and the circumstances surrounding its execution.

A. It is a deed from Daniel B. Brouse and wife to Cyrus F. Flood, I just happened in that evening, the parties met there, when this deed was executed. I don't know nothing more about it than I was present when the Magistrate was there talking to Mr. Brouse about making this deed.
