The foregoing Petition and the answer of Defendants having been by the Court duly read and considered, it is therefore this 6th day of December 1911, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity and by the authority thereof, ordered, adjudged and decreed that John Francis Smith, of Frederick County, Maryland, be and he is hereby appointed Receiver of the Roy B. Wanner Company, a body corporate, to take charge of its affairs and assets, and that the said Roy B. Wanner Company turn over to said Receiver its books, papers, promissory notes, writings, obligations, claims, and demands, and all property of every kind and description it may have, and that said Receiver shall proceed to wind up the affairs of said Company.

And it is further ordered that the said John Francis Smith Receiver shall give notice to all of the Creditors of said Corporation to file their claims in due form of law, and it is further ordered that said Receiver shall prosecute and defend all suits at law now pending, and shall as soon as possible make a full and complete report of the condition of the affairs of said Corporation to this Court. And it is further ordered that said Receiver before he enters upon his duties as such, shall give the usual bond in the sum of Ten Thousand dollars, for the faithful performance of his duties as such receiver.
