That as such trustees, the said Vincent Sebald and the respondent have heretofore filed a demurrer to the plaintiffs amended Bill, and in the judgment of this respondent, the defendants above named their rights and interests are represented in their proceeding by said trustees, and it was unnecessary for said plaintiffs to make said life beneficiaries parties to the amended Bill, and it is unnecessary for them to either answer, plead or demur thereto.
