lifetime, to wit: May 14th 1885, executed a last will and testament, which has been duly admitted to probate and recorded among the will records of Frederick County, in Liber 2, L. No. 1 folio 21, as will more fully appear by reference to a Certified Copy of said will filed herewith and marked Exhibit G, that by the terms of said will the said Samuel Braudenburg devised the real estate herein mentioned unto his wife, Juliann C. Braudenburg for and during her life or widowhood and named his three sons, Cornelius W. Braudenburg, Martin T. Braudenburg (now deceased) and Henry L. Braudenburg, as his executors, but which said will your Complainants are advised provided said Executors with no adequate and sufficient power of sale.

Fifth, that the property herein mentioned is not susceptible of division without great loss and injury to the parties thereto entitled, and the said property is at present unoccupied by the life tenant who owing to her extreme age is unable to give the same her personal supervision and attention, and by reason thereof the said property is depreciating in value to such an extent that it would be to the great benefit and advantage of all the parties concerned, and especially the infant defendants that the said property be sold, and the proceeds distributed among the parties entitled thereto under the direction of your Honorable Court.

To the end, therefore,

(A) that the property mentioned in this Bill of Complaint may be sold by a trustee to be appointed by your Honorable Court, and the proceeds thereof distributed among the parties thereto entitled, under the direction of your Honorable Court.

(B). And for such other and further relief as the nature and equity of their case may require, May it please your Honor to grant unto your Complainants the writ of Subpoena in the usual form against the said, Juliann C. Braudenburg, Widow; Samuel T. Braudenburg and Lizzie Braudenburg, his wife; Emma D. Braudenburg, widow; Rufus Edgar Braudenburg, Alva Franklin Braudenburg, Clara Percilla Braudenburg and Corlie Tyson Braudenburg, infants, and Cornelius W. Braudenburg and Henry L. Braudenburg, surviving Executors under the will Samuel Braudenburg, all of
