

No. 9014. Equity.

I have heretofore from time to time advanced to Certain of my Said Children various Sums of money, which I have heretofore and will continue to enter in a Small account book, the name of the Child and the amount charged and advanced to such Child; all such Sums so charged in Said Book, being intended by me as advancements with each Child so Summed, shall be charged in the Settlement of my estate.

It is my object, making this my last Will and Testament to distribute my property and estate that in the final Settlement of my estate, each of my said Children shall receive an equal share, in the progress of the Settlement of my estate, it shall appear that this will as heretofore expressed does not successfully accomplish my said object, then it is my will and desire that in making a final Settlement of my estate, such distribution shall be made by the orphan Court, so that each of my said Children shall receive an equal share of the whole of my estate.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my three worthy Sons, Josiah Englar, John D. Englar, and Nathan A. Englar Executors of this my last will and Testament revoking and annulling, all former Wills by me heretofore made, ratifying and confirming this and none other to be this my last Will and Testament.
