The joint and separate answers of Margaret T. Englar

and others in No. 9014. Equity in the Circuit Court for Frederick
County in Equity. Their respondents say for an answer, they admit
the allegations contained in the first and second paragraphs

the sale of said real estate, and a distribution
of the proceeds among the parties entitled according
