Eli G. Haugh, a witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the Idors of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, Maryland. I reside in Frederick, Maryland.

I know all the parties to this Suit. Josiah Englar and John D. Englar are both dead, they were brothers of Nathan A. Englar, dead.

Josiah Englar's children are Harry Englar the Plaintiff in this case, who is an adult son.

John Englar, an adult son, whose wife's name is Emma.

Maurice Englar an adult daughter, married E. Joseph Englar.

The four last named persons live in New Windsor, Maryland.

There is also an adult daughter Miss Carrie Englar who was never married, and whose mind is affected and who has been for some years confined in the Springfield Asylum.

Miss Lydia Englar, a sister of Nathan A. Englar is dead and never was married, and left no child or children and her heirs at law and next of kin are the children of her Brother, Josiah Englar as named above by me, and the two children of John D. Englar.

deceased, viz:—

Wenon Englar, who is an adult and whose wife's name is Myrtle Englar, an adult who reside in Union Bridge, Maryland.

Margaret Englar, an adult daughter of John D. Englar, died who is unmarried, and a resident of Baltimore.

I know the lands and real estate mentioned and described in this Cause, and it consists of a farm of about 164 acres, more or less.

This farm and land is not susceptible of partition or division among the parties entitled to interest therein without loss and damage, and the only way is to have it sold under a decree of the Court of Equity and the proceeds divided among the parties according to their respective interests.
