

## NO 9011. Equity.

God, and my body to the earth, to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named, and after my debts and funeral charges are paid, I devise and bequeath as follows.

I give and bequeath unto my wife Elinor J. L. Mussetter, during her natural life, all my personal estate.

It also I give and bequeath unto my said wife during her natural life my Farm whereon I now dwell, lying in Frederick County, and known by the name of Common Manor containing by Patent One thousand and seven acres more or less.

After the death of my said wife I direct that all of my real and personal estate be sold and the proceeds disposed of as follows.

I give and bequeath unto Lewis P. Mussetter, Ten hundred dollars.

I give devise and bequeath all the rest and residue of the proceeds of my real and personal estate to be equally divided among my son Lewis P. Mussetter and daughters Sarah A. Harmer and Mary Jane Mussetter, in equal portions, share and share alike.

Item, I give and bequeath to my Sister Margaret Mussetter my undivided interest in the land my father, Michael Mussetter did Seize of, the same being part of Middle Plantation, during her natural life. I also empower her to sell it, or any part thereof and pay my part of the proceeds thereof to my Executor.

And lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my dear wife, Elinor J. L. Mussetter to be sole Executor of this my last will and Testament revoking and annulling all my former Wills by me heretofore made, ratifying and confirming this and none other, to be my last will and Testament.

In Testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty fifth day of July in the year of our Lord, One thousand Eight hundred and sixty six.
