law, to wit: Mary Ellen Brooks, a Sister, who is unmarried;
 James Brooks, a Brother; Lida Snowden, a Sister, who is
 a widow; and the following children of Charles Brooks, a
 deceased brother, to wit: James Brooks, whose wife's name is
 Susan Brooks; Marshall Brooks, whose wife's name is Ida
 Brooks; Milton Brooks; William Brooks, whose wife's name
 is Ophelia Brooks; Ella Leamprell, who intermarried with -
 Leamprell; and Emma Easton, who intermarried with - Easton;
 all of whom, with the exception of the said Mary Ellen Brooks,
 are non-residents of the State of Maryland.

The bill prays for the following relief, to-wit: That the
 real Estate of the said Moses Brooks may be sold and the
 proceeds applied to the payment of the Claim of the Complainant
 out, and such other conditions of the said Moses Brooks, who
 may come in and contribute to the costs and expenses of
 this proceeding, and the residue paid under the direction
 of the Court. It is therefore, this 22d day of December, in
 the year nineteen hundred and twelve, ordered by the
 Circuit Court for Frederick County, in Equity, that the
 Plaintiff, by causing a copy of this order to be inserted
 in some newspaper published in Frederick County, once
 in each of four successive weeks before the 25th day of
 January A. D. 1913, give notice to the said absent Defendants
 of the object and substance of this Bill, warning them to
 appear in this Court in Person or by Solicitor on or before
 the 10th day of February, A. D. 1913, and to show cause,
 if any they have, why a decree ought not to be granted as
 prayed.
