a son whose wife's name is Susan Brooks; Marshall Brooks a son, whose wife's name is Ida Brooks, all of whom reside in York, State of Pennsylvania; Milton Brooks, a son who is now dead; William Brooks, a son whose wife's name is Aphelia Brooks, who reside in Lancaster, State of Pennsylvania; Ella Campbell, a daughter, who is married but whose husband's name I do not know, who reside at South, State of Massachusetts; Emma Easton, a daughter, who is also married, and whose husband's name I do not know, who reside in Boston, State of Massachusetts. All of the above heirs at law are adults.

The personal estate of which Moses Brooks moved at the time of his death was of practically no value, and I know it would be entirely insufficient to pay the claim of Mrs. Fitch, the General Director which I understand is in the neighborhood of Forty-five dollars. In my judgment the property described in Exhibit A is worth between Two hundred and Fifty and Three hundred dollars.

Robert A. Hefner, A Witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the Plaintiff, being first duly sworn and examined viva voce, deposes and says as follows:-

My name is Robert A. Hefner, a witness of lawful age, and reside near Dominion, in Frederick County, Maryland. I knew Moses Brooks during his lifetime, and he was seized and possessed of a certain piece of property lying and being in Frederick County, which is correctly described in Exhibit A, now shown me,

The said Moses Brooks died on or about the 18th day of September, A.D. 1919, leaving surviving him the following heirs at law, to-wit:- Mary Ellen Brooks, a sister who I understand is an inmate of Montrose, Frederick County, which is correctly described in Exhibit A, now shown me; Jarred Brooks, a brother, who has been away for such a long time that I barely recollect him; Lyda Snowden, a sister, who live in Rochester, State of New York; and the children of Charles Brooks, a brother, who died intestate sometime ago, before the death of the said Moses Brooks. I know I know he had a number of children, and, as I stated above, I do not remember their names now. I know where they reside, I think there were about six children, and as I stated above, I do not remember their names, they are all scattered now and some live in Frederick County. They are all adults above the age of twenty-one years.

Moses Brooks left practically no personal property, and certainly not a sufficient amount to pay the claim of C. H. Fitch, which I understand amounts to Forty or Fifty dollars. In my judgment the property described in Exhibit A is worth about \$250.00 or \$300.00.
