

State of Massachusetts, all of the above heirs at law are adults.

Fourth--That the personal estate left by the said Moses Brecks at the time of his death was sufficient to pay the debt of the said Moses Brecks and costs of administration and that the real estate mentioned in Exhibit A be sold under a decree of your Honorable Court and proceeds therefrom to be applied after the payment of all public dues and charges and a reasonable solicitor's fee to the payment of the claim of your petitioners and such other of the creditors of the said Moses Brecks as may come in and contribute to the costs and expenses of this suit.

To the end therefore-- (a) That the real estate mentioned in exhibit A may be sold and the proceeds applied to the payment of the claims of your complainant and such other creditors of the said Moses Brecks who may come in and contribute to the costs and expenses of this proceeding, and the residue paid under the direction of your Honorable Court.

(b) And for such other and further relief as the nature and equity of the case may require.

May it please your Honors to grant unto your complainant the writ of subpoena in the usual form against the said Mary Ellen Brecks, who is an inmate of Montevue Frederick Co. Md., commanding her to be and appear in your Honorable Court some day certain to be named therein, either in person by solicitor, to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed therein.

And for an order of publication against the said Jarred Brecks, Lida Snowden, widow, James Brecks, and Susan Brecks, his wife, Marshall Brecks and Ida Brecks his wife, Milton Brecks, William Brecks and Ophelia Brecks, his wife, Ella Campbell and ----- Campbell, her husband, Emma Easton and ----- Easton, her husband, all of whom are non residents of the State of Maryland, giving notice of the substance and object of this bill of complaint and warning them to be and appear in your Honorable Court either in person or by solicitor, on or before a day certain to be named therein, to show cause, if any they have, why a decree should not be passed as prayed. And as in duty bound, etc.
